Defining a Loving Pedagogy



"Love is seeing, hearing, and connecting from the heart" (Loreman, 2011)



"Professional love is emotional availability and trust" (Page, 2018):



Krishnamurti said it is learning through care and empathy (Thapan, 2022)



Pedagogy in teaching is about trust, acceptance, equality (Maatta & Uusiautti,2011)



Where is Love in Policy?

- Scottish Frameworks No explicit mention "loved, nurture, kindness, compassion, respected"
- HE frameworks = no mention
- Is it political? Is it gendered? Or it is just uncomfortable?



Current findings

A study carried out by Scottish Government (2018), looked at National Indicators to see how Scotland in performing in varying areas.

Child Wellbeing and happiness in Scotland between 2015 and 2018, results showed that 15% of children aged 4-12 were below 'normal' happiness levels.

Adult loneliness was 21.3%




Gender, Power, and Love
