	received from 1 <sup>st</sup> July 2025 onwards will be notified of

	Your offer will be conditional if you still have
	examinations to take, we need verification of your
	qualifications, or if you must meet other non-academic
	entry requirements. Your offer will state the

	achieve, plus any non-academic requirements. Unless
	an earlier date is specified in your offer, all academic
	conditions must be met in full by <b>22<sup>rd</sup> August 2025</b> .

Can I do paid work whilst training	It is possible to fit some paid work on days off or on
	your annual leave, but it is important to remember that
	the course is a full-time course which is demanding and
	challenging, and you will be required to work a range of
	day, night, and weekend shifts as part of your clinical
	practice experiences, which may take you away from
	your local area for periods of time.
